


# 22 Years of making a difference for Marion County teachers and kids

The 2021-2022 school year marked our 21st year of operations and the first year for teachers to return to the classroom after the COVID-19 pandemic.

Teachers' Treasures has distributed **\$85** million in school supplies since opening our doors in the 2000-2001 school year. This past year, **\$10** million in school supplies were distributed, a **22% increase** compared to the 2020-2021 school year and **20x** the distribution our first year of operations.




